What is this on-line course about?

The goal of this on-line course is to encourage critical thinking about technology as it applies to our lives. Participants will explore new definitions of technology, examine how tightly technology is woven into daily life, and technology's effects (good, bad and ugly) on our lives. A variety of readings, in class discussions and message boards will be used.

In this 7 WEEK COURSE you will

Identify and define various categories of technology.

Identify and describe the symbiotic relationship between technology development and society.

Identify and describe the relationship between consumerism and consumption.

Identify and describe the environmental effects of consumption, consumerism and technology.

Articulate the relationship between politics and technology development.

Identify and articulate the problems and solutions of the digital divide.

Develop computer and electronic communication skills.
